

Statement REACH, Rohs, Conflict Minerals

1. RoHS substances as defined in EU directive 2011/65/EU

Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Union concerning the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronics equipment (Rohs) became operative as of 3 January 2013.

Following substances namely are involved:

- O Lead (Pb)
- O Cadmium (Cd)
- O Hexavalent Chromium (Cr6)
- O Polybrominated biphenyls (PBB)
- O Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE)
- O Mercury (Hg)

We, Sumho cable declares that all of our products are manufactured in conformance with this Directive.

2. REACH Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) as defined in EU directive 1907/2006/EC

According to our suppliers, none of materials used in our products contain substances included on the SVHC-List in a concentration of more than 0.1 mass percent contained.

We constantly monitor our suppliers for conformance with these regulations. Should any of our products require notification under Article 33, we will inform you.

3. Conflict Mineras

On 15 July 2010 US Congress passed the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Dodd-Frank Act), including regulations for so-called Conflict Minerals. This legislation affects businesses using tantalum, tin, tungsten or gold in their products or in the production of their products; and requires certain businesses to compile a yearly report to the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), INDICATING IF THESE MINERALS ORIGINATE IN THE Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or neighboring countries.

At this time, we have no indication that any of our products could include Conflict Minerals.
